



WHEN an old school dies—demolition teams moved in on Wallington Independent Grammar School in Stafford Road last week.

History fell before the mechanical hammer as the 50-years-old school was reduced to foundation level.

Founded by a Mr Hopkins, the school provided education for boys aged from 10 to 18 years.

"Tuition for general certificate examinations and 'O' and 'A' levels," a sign on the front of the building said.

The school closed suddenly on July 13, 1972—surprising pupils and parents who had to find alternative education for their children.

It is not known to what use the prime building site will be put.
